FEBRUARY IS SPAY/NEUTER MONTH CAA LAUNCHES "STOP LITTERING" CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Each year, millions of healthy cats and dogs are euthanized simply because there are not enough homes for them. If all pet owners spayed or neutered their pets, we could see an end to this practice in our lifetime. Spaying/neutering your pet is an integral part of responsible pet ownership and imperative to helping end the unnecessary euthanasia due to pet overpopulation. To help bring attention to this important issue, humane organizations have named February Spay/Neuter month, with the Humane Society of the United States naming February 23rd - SPAY DAY USA.

In recognition of Spay/Neuter month, CAA is expanding the "STOP LITTERING" campaign to inform pet owners of the importance of spaying/ neutering their pets, as well as creating a resource for all NJ pet owners that makes the procedure affordable. The program has been modified to include a low-cost certificate program to assist pet owners in need. CAA can assist you to have your pet spayed/neutered for a reduced cost, or possibly at no cost. CAA is proud to partner with People for Animals Low-Cost Spay-Neuter Clinic in order to make this program possible.

NJ Passes Strong Fur Labeling Law



NJ became the fifth state to pass a fur-labeling law in an attempt to close a federal loophole. "This bill has to do with the consumers' right to know what they're wearing — whether it's cotton, silk, polyester, mink or dog fur," said Sen. Jeff Van Drew, D-1. "The bottom line is that there are people walking around wearing dog fur, who don't know it." NY has similar legislation in place.

The Humane Society of the US documented many retailers selling unlabeled fur-trimmed jackets as "faux," "raccoon" or "rabbit" that actually came from domestic dogs or raccoon dogs, an Asian canine species. They maintain that China kills, often by skinning alive, an estimated 2 million dogs and cats for their fur annually. The federal fur labeling law still permits products with a "relatively small quantity or value" to go unlabeled. To close this loophole the Truth in Fur Labeling Act was introduced in Congress.

Create a First-Aid Kit for Your Pets — Before an Emergency Strikes

No one ever knows when an emergency will happen. The best thing is to always be prepared. Therefore, putting together a water-proof first-aid kit for your pets prior to an emergency, is one of the best things that you can do as a pet owner. Many situations require fast action and prevention of further injury, infection or death. So assemble a first aid kit now, so that you'll be ready when your pet needs immediate help. Below is a listing of some items that you should include in your kit:

- * An index card with emergency numbers such as:
 - * Animal Poison Control contact information
 - Your pets regular <u>veterinarian</u> and local Veterinary
 Emergency Animal Hospital information
 - * Your own phone number
 - Photos of your pets (to help identify them)
 - * Pet's health records
 - Pet CPR instructions
 - * Your pets microchip number
- * Flashlight & rubber gloves
- Scissors & tweezers (flat slant tip)
- * Sterile needle (to remove splinters and tick heads)
- * Turkey baster (for flushing wounds or force feeding)
- Eyedropper
- * Tongue depressor to examine mouth
- Disposable safety razor (to shave fur around a wound)
- * Towels (at least 2)
- * Blanket (to keep an injured pet from going into shock)
- 3x3 sterile gauze pads & rolled gauze (for bandaging, stabilizing joints, making a muzzle)
- * Anti-bacterial wipes or pads & Q-tips

- Ice pack
- Cotton balls and vet wrap bandages
- Hydrogen peroxide 3% USP (to use on infected wounds)
- * Activated charcoal tablets (can absorb many toxics)
- * Antibiotic ointment (such a Neosporin)
- * Sterile saline eye solution (to flush out eyes and wounds)
- Milk of magnesia (for stomach upset and some types of poison ingestion)
- Pepto Bismol (for stomach upset and some types of poison ingestion; do not give to cats)
- Plain Benadryl (for bug bites and stings and other allergic reactions)
- Can of soft pet food (can reduce the effect of poisoning)
- Mild grease-cutting dishwashing liquid such as Dawn (to clean contaminated skin or sticky substances)
- * Plastic baggies
- * Muzzle and a nylon leash
- Bottled water & water bowl or container
- Adhesive first aid tape (in narrow and wide widths)

There are many more items that you can include. Please consult your vet for some additional ideas.

Immediate and proper first-aid is only the first step in the treatment of your pet. Please contact your veterinarian immediately and follow their instructions to ensure that your pet is well-cared for when a trauma has taken place.

COMPANION ANIMAL ADVOCATES - WHAT WE DO

Our pets are members of our family. But sometimes a family has to think about giving up their pets because they are moving, have an allergic child in the family, or simply because they can no longer afford to feed the pet.

If a family has to give up their pet, what can they do? Find a new home for the pet OR give it to a shelter and hope they can find a good home for the pet.

- Companion Animal Advocates helps people in need keep their pets in their family by providing food to help the pet stay healthy and to reduce the family's cost of keeping a pet.
- Companion Animal Advocates helps people who are eligible for low cost spay/neuter through the State of NJ get this done for the health of their pet and to reduce pet overpopulation.
- If there is no way to help the family keep their pet, Companion Animal Advocates works with the family to help them find a new home for their pet. Helping the owner find a new home for their pet helps reduce the number of homeless pets in the shelter and is less upsetting to the pet.
