PET FOOD DRIVES TO BENEFIT OPERATION FEED-A-PET

Our program has been the recipient of a tremendous amount of food & other donations thanks to the following groups/individuals that have recently held pet food drives. Our monthly food distribution to the Center for Food Action (CFA) locations in Mahwah, Ringwood & Saddle Brook as well as Ridgewood Social Services have all benefited. We were also able to distribute food to the CFA in Hackensack & Rocky's Pet Pantry in Hawthorne.

GRANTS AND DONATIONS

The Petco Foundation awarded CAA \$2,500 as part of its "We Are Family, Too" grant which provides short-term and seed funding for specific programs created by animal welfare groups who help pet owners who have lost their homes or are experiencing temporary financial hurdles keep their animals.

We also received a grant from Best Friends Animal Society in partnership with PetSmart Charities for \$6,000 towards 100 spay/neuter procedures for any Center for Food Action client.

Finally, the ASPCA awarded us a \$1,000 grant to be used for Operation Feed-A-Pet.

PET OXYGEN MASK DONATIONS



The Humane Education program has been a huge success. Since it's inception, this program has donated more than 60 sets of pet oxygen masks throughout Bergen and Passaic Counties. Our goal is to have every town in Bergen County equipped with a set.

The \$100 tax-deductible donation includes: 3 oxygen masks (1 small, 1 medium & 1 large), 3 oxygen air tubes (1 for each mask) 1 O2 Fur Life carry bag (for storage & mobility), 1 laminated instruction sheet, 1 kennel lead, 2 "Pet Oxygen Masks On Board" decals, 1 PowerPoint presentation (for personnel training), 1 instructional DVD "Pets Need Oxygen Too", 2 animal

COMPANION ANIMAL ADVOCATES - WHAT WE DO

Our pets are members of our family. But sometimes a family has to think about giving up their pets because they can no longer afford to feed the pet.

If a family has to give up their pet for this reason, what can they do? Find a new home for the pet OR give it to a shelter and hope they can find a good home for the pet.

- Companion Animal Advocates helps people in need keep their pets in their family by providing food through its Operation Feed-A-Pet program to help the pet stay healthy and to reduce the family's cost of keeping a pet.
- Companion Animal Advocates helps provide responsible pet owners with affordable spay neuter options through its Stop Littering program, allowing for healthier pets while reducing pet overpopulation.
- Companion Animal Advocates also provides community outreach through its Humane Education program. This program was designed to educate the community on such topics as Pet CPR, pet hazards and pet health. We do this through lectures with local vets at public libraries or at vet hospitals. This year, CAA also spearheaded a campaign that is trying to get every town in Bergen County equipped with pet oxygen masks, in case of emergency.
